Message from the Executive Director

We have over 800 active volunteers, and I am continually amazed at their huge hearts, the care and love they pour into our community. They truly make us who we are.

The best part of my job, for all these 15 years, has been to witness the daily acts of kindness that these men and women, and even children are making to better the lives of our participants. Reel Recovery is filled (page 3) with people like David, who act with care and kindness far beyond expectation; like Ben, who feel it's a "privilege" to help others; like Wes, who literally share their strength in support of our men.

From Virginia volunteer Gary Parsons, who was preparing a presentation to a local community club: "My grandkids had the day off from school so my daughter brought them over to visit. I had them watch and critique the finished slide show and parts of my talk. After they left, I went into the bedroom, and on my side of the bed was a torn piece of note paper with the message "for Reel Recovery" along with a one-dollar bill, two quarters, and a penny from my 10-year-old granddaughter Campbell!" \$1.51; one of our most meaningful gifts ever.

> And from our Glen Rose Texas Retreat, where every year a local resident, Jimmy Gosdin, donates his pond for fishing and a fantastic fish fry for the entire group (another act of kindness!). 11-year-old Cullen, part of the Gosdin family, came to help his mom with the fish fry. After witnessing all the fun, joy and friendship that was happening around him, Cullen offered the group a \$50 bill—his "mowing

money" he'd earned that summer, "hoping to help more men like these


Plumbers & Steamfitters Local Union #434—Charity Golf Tournament


Sharing Their Stories....
